Gwendolynn M. Bullock, of St. James, Missouri passed away Thursday, January 26, 2017 at the Phelps County Regional Medical Center in Rolla, Missouri at the age of 82.

Gwendolynn was born in Redding, England on March 22, 1934 to the late Alfred and Florence (Burchhill) Green.

Gwendolynn told stories about growing up during WWII and how she and her family spend many hours in the bomb shelters; she talked about how the family survived on a very small allotment of food ration stamps; It was during this time that Gwendolynn met the love of her life, a soldier named Jack Bullock who was stationed near her home; On September 6, 1952 Gwendolynn and Jack became Mr. & Mrs. Jack Bullock, this union was blessed with five children. Coming to America was somewhat of an adjustment, she fondly remembered the first trip to the grocery store where she could buy whatever and however much without a ration stamp, she loved her "adopted country" but still missed her family and her country; Gwendolynn loved The Queen and Royal family and watched and listened to all she could about news from her homeland. She really loved to sew and make crafts, so when the time came for her to get a career what better than at California Manufacturing a job where she could sew all day making coats; Gwendolynn loved and adored her family and was always happy spending time with them. She also met Ann Koeber who was also from England. They had arrived in the United States about the same time, both living in St. James; they developed a lifelong friendship, and were both beneficial to each other in the days they craved their homeland. Gwendolynn was a loving and devoted mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend who will be greatly missed by all that knew and loved her.

Gwendolynn Bullock is survived by her children, Steven Bullock, of Springfield, MO, Richard Bullock, of Springfield, MO, Sandra Nazafi and husband Koorsh, of San Ramon, CA, and Eric Bullock and wife Bonnita, of St. James, MO; sisters, Doris Gibbard, of Redding England, and Iris Taphouse and husband Les, of Redding, England; grandchildren, Scott, Sara, Bijan, Rahmein, and Christopher; beloved friend, Ann Koeber, of St. James, MO; a host of great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, extended family and
