



## Delphia Mae Bacon

May 11, 1932 - November 1, 2015

Delphia Mae (Quick) Bacon was born in Max, Missouri to William H. Quick and Alza O'Beady Deardeuff Quick on May 11, 1932 and entered into rest in Springfield, Missouri, Sunday morning November 1, 2015 at the age of 83. She was a loving and faithful wife, mother, grandmother. She loved her family unconditionally and everyone knew that you didn't get between her and her family. She taught a Sunday School Class for an elementary group, worked a short time at the Shoe Factory, was head cook for a program for 200 children at Northwood R-4, and later became the head cook for the Salem Memorial Hospital. She was well known for cooking her Wednesday night church suppers for both Salem First Baptist Church and North Nixa Baptist Church, cooking for large family dinners, the 50th Wedding Anniversary for her father and mother, and for her in-laws, Basil and Ollie Bacon. Cooking large dinners was a joy to her and her ministry contribution to her church. I'm sure she has found a new place of service in her new home.
