



Florence June Wynn

August 12, 1929 - September 7, 2025

(Florence) June Pilger Wynn was born August 12, 1929 in the family home in Phelps County, Dillon Township outside Rolla, Mo. to Louisa (Willson) Pilger and (Charles) Laurence Pilger. She and her twin brother, Laurence Pilger, Jr. were the youngest of eight children.

June met George J. Wynn when he returned from WWII and was working on his pilot's license. He gave plane rides to friends for a small fee, but to June for fun, which displeased her mother. June enjoyed flying with George during their courtship and they wed on December 25, 1947. June and George settled in St. James, where they enjoyed gardening, tending their vineyard and orchard, and fishing. June's greatest joy, however, was found in raising their two children, Brenda (Wynn) Bunton of Lamar, Mo., and Alan Wynn of St. James, Mo. June and George were active members of St. James Christian Church until George's death in April 2000, and June remained a member until her passing. June did not enjoy being idle and delighted in serving on the church's hospitality committee, with the Missionary Mite Society, as well as serving meals to the children's preschool and to friends who were homebound.

June was proud of her long civil service career as a cartographer with the U.S. Geological Survey. Prior to that, she worked as a seamstress. However, June's biggest source of pride came from the seven grandchildren she and

George shared. She was a skilled baker and cook and used her masterful sewing skills to make beautiful handmade clothing, including wedding gowns, for her daughter, three granddaughters, and many nieces. She loved RVing and boating with George and after retirement, would enjoy long fishing trips, often taking along her grandkids. Cooking for her family brought her great joy, and she continued hosting Sunday family dinners even into her final months.

June was preceded in death by her parents, Louisa and Laurence, her husband, George, all seven of her siblings, and one grandson, Daniel. She is survived by her two children, her daughter, Brenda (Martin) Bunton of Lamar, Mo. and son Alan (Cathy) Wynn of St. James, Mo. She is also survived by six grandchildren, eleven great-grandchildren, and many nieces and nephews.
