



## Ludmilla (Millie) Cole

May 15, 1915 - March 4, 2017

Ludmilla (Millie) Cole, age 101, of Rolla, MO died Saturday, March 4, 2017, at the St. James Living Center in St. James, MO. Millie Cole had resided in Rolla for 60 years before residing in the St. James Living Center.

Ludmilla Braxmeier was born May 5, 1915 in the Village of Prelate in the Canadian Province of Saskatchewan, the daughter of Conrad and Margaret (Webber) Braxmeier. After graduating from high school in Mandan, ND, she enrolled at the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks, ND. The onset of World War II interrupted her studies as she became a civilian employee with the U.S. Army working as a Medical Technologist at the Phelps County Regional Medical Center in Rolla for 30 years retiring in 1984.
