Robert Thomas Cash "Bob" of St. James, Missouri passed away Wednesday, September 16, 2015 at the Buffalo Prairie Care Center in Buffalo, Missouri at the age of 82. Bob was born in Bogart, Georgia on December 10, 1929 to the late Ernest Lamar and Marion (Conrad) Cash.

Bob graduated from high school and went to work for the Athens Drive-In Theatre in Athens, Georgia from 1950-1953, he then enlisted in the United States Army where he served his Country in the Korean War; after his two year service in the Army he re-enlisted into the Army Reserves for another eight years, spending time in Vietnam during the Vietnam War; Bob was very proud of this Country and was proud to have served.

It was on November 2, 1972 when Bob would marry the love of his life Daisy Parks Kitchen, this union would also include her children; Bob and Daisy settled into life and shared their love of gardening, they always looked forward to having a big garden that they could share with family, friends, and neighbors; what they didn't share Daisy would can and make fresh jams and jellies

that they were able to enjoy during the long winter months.

A love of fishing was also something they shared, they really enjoyed going to St. Elizabeth, Missouri and going to Tavern Creek and the Osage River to fish. Daisy had a stroke in 1991 and was not able get out much, but here is where Bob stepped in, he took wonderful care of Daisy until her death in November

of 2009. After her death Bob started getting out a little, he enjoyed playing pool, going to BINGO with his daughter, he even managed to get a little fishing in; he also enjoyed going out for lunch, and meeting new people; He was a people person, but unfortunately he always took people for their word, he wanted so bad to see the good of the world, that perhaps he didn't see the bad, this was unfortunate because it hurt him so much in the end.

Robert Thomas Cash is survived by his devoted daughter and caretaker Mary Cameron, of the home; son Richard Kitchen and wife Janice, of Salem, MO; grandchildren, Tammy Koster and husband Joe, Rick Kitchen and wife Kathy, Patricia Seaman and husband Rocky; Amanda Miller and husband Lyle, and Robert Cameron; sister Sherry Sue Copeland, of Marietta, GA; sister-in-law, Esther Cash, of Conyers, GA; 7 great-grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, extended family and friends. In addition to his parents Bob was preceded in death by his wife Daisy, and brother William Cash.

Funeral services for Robert Thomas Cash will be held Monday, September 21, 2015 at 1:00PM at the St. James Chapel of the James & Gahr Mortuary with Reverend Mick Thrasher officiating. “ I am so sorry because I loved Bob Cash. The last time I talked to him was in the PX in Frankfurt, Germany about 1968. My husband had been drafted and he was stationed there. It was quite a surprise to walk in to the cafeteria and see him at a table. Shocked him, too. I told him that it was a treat for me to see him come from the school in Bogart(I was about 3 to 4 years old. I would get Papa to let me run to meet him. He would hold his arm strait out to the side from his shoulder and I would lock my fingers over it, curl up my feet and he would walk like that to Papa's store.... with me dangling like a Christmas tree decoration. I got a kick out of that. He got a laugh about it that day I talked to him in the PX.Bob had the greatest grin. I remember Bob coming to talk to my dad before he enlisted.....from what I remember of the conversation, Daddy tried to talk him out of it. He had seen Bob grow up and thought a lot of him. I remember being upset because I did not want to see him leave Bogart. My father had been in the Normandy Invasion, wounded, and still suffering from the memory of it I really did love Bob. I would love to talk to his daughter.
